

Sexual & Reproductive Health and Human Rights

- Focus tested the Living Well: Women With HIV resource
- Research project:

 Positively Women: An arts based research project to support the sexual and reproductive health and rights of Women Living With HIV in Australia [facilitated by Patricia Morgan]
 - Phase 1 will be a collaborative art workshop in June 2020 with 15 Women LWHIV
 - Phase 2 a public art exhibition around World AIDS Day 2020

Past & Present

Sexual & Reproductive Health and Human Rights

- Facilitated a National Women's Symposium to formalise a consensus statement for the Federal Government in relation to the 8th National HIV Strategy, looking to name women as a priority population [July 2017]
 - While represented as a sub-population, women were not given equal status in the National Strategy
 - aims: after presenting to sexual health services, that 90% of women should be routinely offered a HIV screen
 - aims to normalise HIV testing & treatment, and increase health literacy within a broader health framework

Past & Present

Human Rights: Breastfeeding and WLHIV

- Femfatales questioned issues around breastfeeding in 2017, sent letter to ASHM titled "Review of ASHM Anti-Retroviral Guidelines US DHHS Guidelines with Australian Commentary: HIV Infected Women"
- As a result ASHM formed The ARV Guidelines Review Subcommittee: HIV Positive Women & Breastfeeding, to look at revising the guidelines
- Helped establish terms of reference
- Clinical Guidelines Draft 3 currently being worked on, anticipated they will be launched at ASHM in Sept 2020
- Femfatales & NAPWHA will look to develop a user friendly community resource with women appropriate language



Past & Present

Human Rights: HPV

- Femfatales & Positive Life NSW conducted an on-line survey on HPV & women and trans and gender diverse people knowledge & experiences with HPV testing
- The survey highlighted a lack of awareness of risk prevention, symptoms and early detection of 4 HPV cancers (cervical, vaginal, vulva, anal)
- Women with HIV are much more likely to develop HPV-related cancer
- Future work: assess knowledge gaps to help develop resources, and help increase health care professional and community awareness of HPV and related cancers

Past & Present

National Day of Women Living With HIV

- 5 National Days 2016 2020
- NDWLHIV was created to increase the profile and visibility of Women Living with HIV, at a time when we felt invisible within an already marginalised community
- UN Women's theme is
 I Am Generation Equality: Realising Women's Rights
- #EachForEqual is the Social Media hashtag
- Each year Femfatales has released a media release to align with each National Day
- As a network Femfatales decides what theme to support for the National Day
- As an advisory network to NAPWHA its anticipated that each state and territory will plan & host an event
